Foreword

The Armenian Communities Department (ACD) is committed to transparency and to the evaluation of its work. In 2016 the Department conducted a survey to receive feedback from the organizations it has been funding since the beginning of its Five-year plan. To do so, it based its survey on the existing approach created by the *Center for Effective Philanthropy*.

In this report - in addition to providing a summary - the ACD is taking two further steps: (1) it sets clear commitments on where it will do its best to improve and by when; and (2) shares this information with our grantees. To establish its progress towards these objectives, the ACD will conduct a similar survey in 2018.

Our accountability pushes us further, and we believe our work and relationships with our partners are better for it.





Effect of Department's funding on organization's ability to sustain its work in the future (min=1-max=7)








Satisfaction with Department in comparison to before 2014 (min=1-max=7)


Fairness of treatment received from Department


If a problem arises - comfort approaching Department (min=1-max=7)








Who initiates contact

How clear is the online platform to submit proposal for funding




Time between proposal's submission and clear commitment of funding¹






Clarity of Department's goals and strategy




Coverage of the Department's activities in the Armenian media (interviews, articles, etc.)

Decrease time between submission of proposals for funding and clear commitment of funding, by means of a change of the current online submission form and Departmental proceedings	 A two-tiered online platform will be created where organizations first submit a simplified form. Based on this simplified first form, if ACD believes project has potential, it will invite the organization to submit a more comprehensive application In 2018 ACD will conduct a similar survey and results should show: A decrease in the reported "time between proposal's submission and clear commitment of funding" taking longer than three months
Communications	5. Create a targetted mailing list to inform partners based on the ACD priority they work on	- A targetted mailing list will exist by April 2017
	6. Simplify Department's message and give funded organizations more visibility by means of an online map, or similar visual tool, with our funded projects	 A map with the Department's supported projects, or a similar visual tool, will exist online in 2017
